

## Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. How do I find out about available accommodation?**  
Contact the Busselton Visitor Centre on 9752 1288 or Nannup Visitor Centre 9756-1211
- 2. How can I be an official on the rally?** Easy, you can either download the Official Registration form on [www.wacarclub.com.au](http://www.wacarclub.com.au) or call 9359 1199. You don't need any experience and after 3 days rally experience you can apply to be a CAMS motorsport official.
- 3. Are there facilities for the disabled?** There are limited facilities for the disabled as per below. Due to the fact most stages are in the forest some are more accessible than others. All toilets are standard hire units.  
Busselton Toyota Special Stage: Easy access on flat grass land  
Nannup Service Park: Easy access on foot paths and on the closed road  
Kinky Special Stage: Not recommended  
Healthway Special Stage: Easy access with car parking very near to the spectator point and then reasonably flat grass  
Nannup Oval: It should be possible to find a spot with easy access  
Brockman Special Stage: The best location will be Spectator Point D3, don't go to D1  
Folly Special Stage: Not recommended
- 4. Where will the official start and finish ceremonies be held?** The ceremonial start of the Rally is at the Busselton Toyota Special Stage, Barnard Park, Busselton at 6.00pm on Friday 16<sup>th</sup> April. Immediately following the Start, the rally will commence. There will be no charge for attending.  
  
The ceremonial finish of the Rally and podium celebrations will be held in front of the Nannup Town Hall at 2.30pm on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> April.
- 5. Is there an Entry Fee to watch the rally?** All spectator points are Free to enter including the Busselton Toyota Special Stage in Busselton.
- 6. Is there public transport to get to and from the event?** There is no public transport to any of the stages.
- 7. Is there free car parking available?** Parking is free at all locations. At the Busselton Toyota Special Stage there is plenty of parking to the east of the stage. At all other locations please park as far off the road as you can to allow emergency vehicle access on or off the stage. It is recommended that you arrive 15 minutes before first car to ensure you can park in a safe location, in some places it is best to turn around for an easy exit after the stage finishes.

- 11. - 12. What is a Forest Stage?** These provide the real character of the rally – slippery, muddy forest roads that offer challenging driving conditions which only true Rally Champions overcome! These include Kinky, Healthway, Brockman and Folly Stages.
- 13. What is Busselton Toyota Special Stage?** This is where the rally starts on Barnard Park in Busselton. Immediately after the start each car does 2 laps of the stage with 3 cars running at a time evenly spaced around the track. After all the crews have competed in a clock wise direction, they then do it in anti-clockwise direction. This will be interrupted by driving demonstrations by tarmac specialists.
- On Saturday the Busselton Shannons Sprint will run on the track from 10.00am through to 5.00pm. These drivers are tarmac specialists and their cars are better set up than the gravel guys and hence they will be going a bit quicker. On Saturday evening the rally cars return to do it all over again after a day in the Nannup forests.
- 14. What is the Quit Forest Rally - Moto?** For the first time in Australian Rallying motorbikes and quads will be competing. Not just any motorbike, they need to be set up with navigational equipment as used on the Australasian Safari and Dakar Rally. They will run after all the rally cars have cleared the course and will be running in 30-second intervals. They will add another level of excitement to the event.

- 16. How do I get involved in rallying?** The WA Car Club can help you to get started in rallying either as an official or a competitor or go to the [www.rallywa.com](http://www.rallywa.com) website.
- 17. Is there any safety information I should bear in mind?** We have tried to ensure that you will be able to reach your chosen spectator viewing area without walking on the special stage. If you decide to leave the stage prior to the last competitor, **PLEASE** ensure that you walk on the pathways or behind the tree line. All the competitors will be travelling at high speeds and spectators are strongly advised **NOT** to walk on the rally route.

**All spectators are reminded that Motorsport can be dangerous and despite us taking all reasonable precautions, unavoidable accidents can happen. In respect of these, you are present at your own risk. We ask that you obey all instructions of safety marshals, spectator marshals and police officers in relation to your safety and that of others.**

### SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

#### ALWAYS

- Always STAY ALERT! The unexpected may happen
- Always consider your own safety and that of others at all times.
- Always stand where you can see the competing cars coming and going.
- Always leave yourself room to move away quickly.
- Always keep children under constant and close supervision.
- Always leave pets at home, please don't bring them to a spectator area.
- Always listen to the marshals – they are there to ensure the event runs within the safety guidelines prescribe by the CAMS, the governing body of Australian Motor Sport.
- Always take your litter home with you and keep our forests clean.

#### NEVER

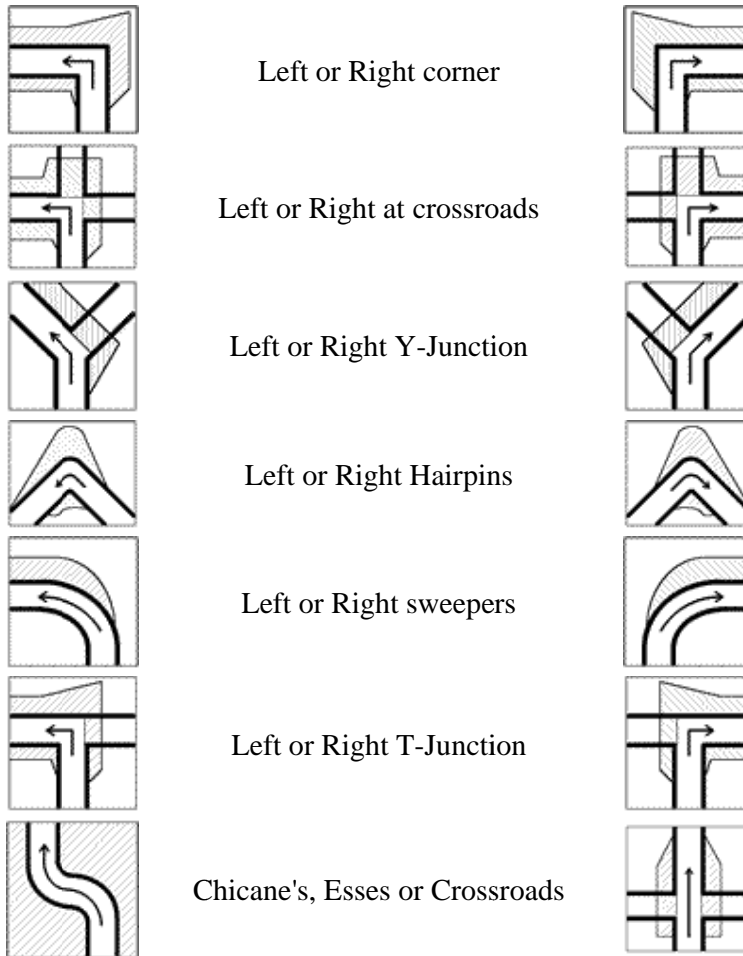
- Never stand in prohibited areas (study the spectator viewing diagrams)
- Never stand or sit close to the edge of the road.
- Never stand below the level of the road (or in gutters or culverts)
- Never stand in run-off (escape) routes for the competing cars
- Never sit down at a location on the same level as the cars - you need to be standing so that you are able to move away quickly if necessary
- Never stand in front of arrows or signs relevant to the running of the event
- Never be distracted - always face the competing cars
- Never stand on or cross the road while it is officially closed
- Never play games with your safety, or with that of the competitors
- Never light fires or BBQs or drop cigarette butts. They can cause major fires with serious consequences.
